
Hizb ut-Tahrir Bangladesh condemns the further arrests of its members who were protesting against offensive cartoons against the Prophet (saw)

Today, 07th September 2007, on the last day of Jummah before the blessed month of Ramadhan, a further 4 members of Hizb ut-Tahrir Bangladesh were arrested while they were distributing leaflets protesting the abusive cartoons against the beloved Prophet (saw). The leaflet called on all Muslims to protest against the cartoons and protect the honour of the noble Prophet (saw).

Chief Coordinator & Spokesman of Hizb ut-Tahrir Bangladesh, Mohiuddin Ahmed, said in a statement, “The Western colonialists have clearly shown their hatred for Muslims and Islam with these unpardonable cartoons. Now the Muslims must stand shoulder to shoulder in resisting these spiteful attacks.” He further added that what is even more alarming is that rather than joining the people in protests, the Government of Bangladesh has chosen to side with the crusaders by arresting those responsible Muslims who sincerely protested.

He demanded that the government: release all those arrested; strongly condemn the cartoons; immediately cut off of all diplomatic and economic ties with Sweden; seek a formal apology from the Government of Sweden.

Mohiuddin Ahmed reiterated that the people will continue to defend the honour of the Prophet (saw) and no amount of pressure will break their resolve.
